The Rev. Dr. Suzanne Watts Henderson is Associate Professor of Religion and Director, Center for Ethics and Religion at Queens University of Charlotte, NC. A New Testament scholar who specializes in the Gospel of Mark, she holds degrees from Princeton Theological Seminary (M.Div) and Duke University (Ph.D.). She has published numerous books and articles. Dr. Watts Henderson is active in the emerging field of interfaith studies and is writing the first pluralistic introduction to the New Testament. She serves on the Board of Bright Stars of Bethlehem (US non-profit that supports Dar al-Kalima University College) and regularly writes and speaks on the topic of the Holy Land.

The Rev, Dr. Mitri Raheb is Founder and President of Dar al-Kalima University College of Arts and Culture in Bethlehem and holds a Doctorate in Theology from the Philipps University of Marburg, Germany. The most widely published Palestinian theologian to date, Dr. Raheb is the author of 16 books. Dr. Raheb has received numerous prizes for his courageous, groundbreaking work to promote peaceful coexistence and equality in Palestine and the Middle East, including the Olof Palme Prize (2015) and the German Media Prize (2012).
