Giving Guide

How much should I give?

This is no small question. It challenges us to ask about who we are, who is in our lives, how we spend our time, and how we spend our money.

What are my priorities? Is it time to rearrange some things?

Here are some insights from the writer and theologian Henri Nouwen:

- God is calling us to relate to our resources in new ways.
- We won't become poorer; we will become *richer* by giving. (See 2 Corinthians 9:6-15.)
- Seek guidance through our connection with Christ: "I am the vine. You are the branches. Those who abide in me bear much fruit." (John 15:5)

Giving comes from the heart, and prayer is essential for determining what to give.

Give thanks for the ways this church has enriched your life. Give thanks for the impact God makes through this congregation. Ask God for guidance.

Evaluate your current giving. Does it express your gratitude? Is it generous? Is it time for you to increase your giving to God and to the work of the church? **Can you bump it up by 1%? or 2%?**

Consider proportional giving: How about 1% of your income? (Before or after taxes? You decide.) How about 2%? Or the biblical example of the tithe, 10%? If you give even a fraction of a percent, your gift is an act of faith.
