MEDITATION

I once saw God dressed as a toad under a rock in my parents' backyard.

On that patch of grass, the world was infinite and so were the stories I told.

I could do magic before it was witchcraft; I was a prince before poverty became the mark of a saint.

Five-year-old me wore a cape. And though he couldn't tell you what love was, with his back firmly planted in the grass, gaps in his baby-toothed smile aimed at the sky, he felt it.

In these times, before my disinterest in sports was problematic to my dad and before Justin's mom decided he didn't need a friend like me, we were too young to be religious, too joyous in the kingdom of my brown, wooden fence.

You couldn't convince me that a god who loved to draw planets and stars in the curved beauty of a circle only loved his children who were straight.

I couldn't tell you when it happened.

When my biggest concern for the day switched from which game to play at recess to the octave of my voice and how often I use my hands to speak.

I confess I lied. To every pastor who asked me what I was praying for: "Good grades," I would say; and, if they were unconvinced, "A girlfriend too."

I wasn't born this way. I have always suspected that hating others is a learned behavior, and I'm beginning to think that hating yourself is too. I drank poison in place of healing one Sunday at a time.

Thus the kingdom of my backyard began to shrink. And as the voice inside me did the same, battle lines were drawn over who had God in their corner.

I still carry the scars. And with every news story; the bruises continue to slip past my ribs. And the world becomes just a bit smaller.

I am still trying to learn the shape and texture of a heart that has finally embraced itself.

But on clear summer days, I close my eyes and think back to that place and have visions of healing redemption of the grandest sort: a revival of all the parts of myself I lost along the way, visions of who I once was... and who I am dying to become.

So, for a poet like me, trying to see God in the chaos, I have to get back to my brown, wooden kingdom.

We must begin
to tell a bigger story.
