How to Enter Your Skills & Interests and Your Pledge in Realm Using a Desktop or Laptop Computer

Enter your Time and Talents in Realm

- 1. In a web browser log in to your Realm account.
- 2. In the left column heading (where it says "North Decatur Presbyterian...") be sure **Connect** is selected.
- 3. Below that click **Serving**.
 - Your Serving Profile opens.
 - In that box look for **Skills**.
 - To update your choices, click the ellipsis (•••) to the right of the word **Skills** and select **Edit**.
- 4. The Manage Skills and Interests section will open to **Skills**. You may skip the Skills section; it is being updated to better match what we need here at NDPC. (If you wish to select or deselect some skills, feel free.)
- 5. Scroll to the bottom of that page and click **Next**.
- 6. The **Interests** section will open. Scroll through the list and select items according to how you wish to participate in the ministries of NDPC. You can also deselect items that no longer apply.
- 7. Scroll all the way to the bottom of the page and click **Done**.

How to Make Your Pledge in Realm using a Web browser.

- 1. Be sure you are signed in to Realm.
- 2. Click **Giving** in the left column; the Giving page opens.
- 3. At the top, click + **Pledge** to open the form.
- 4. Be sure that the **Start Date** and **End Date** are for the coming year.
- 5. *Before* you enter the Amount, decide whether you want to set up a recurring gift (e.g Once a Month). If so, select **Set a Schedule**. If you would rather enter your total pledge and give as you are able throughout the year, select **As Can**.
- 6. Enter the **amount** you want to pledge.
 - Note that the number you enter in the "Amount Pledged" field is the amount *per payment*. The "Total Pledge" will calculate automatically.
- 7. Click Save Pledge.



Using the REALM CONNECT app on a mobile device

How to Enter your Skills & Interests using the mobile app

- 1. Open the Realm Connect app.
 - If you are not logged in, please do so.
- 2. At the bottom of the screen tap the ellipsis (•••) above the word **More**.
- 3. On the More screen tap **Serving**.
- 4. Under the title of the next screen you'll see three choices. Choose **Serving**.
 - The next screen will display several categories, including **Skills** and **Interests**.
- 5. Tap Interests.
- 6. STEP 1/2: Select your skills. (You may skip this part. Tap NEXT
- 7. STEP 2/2: Select your interests Scroll through the choices and check or uncheck items according to how you wish to participate in the ministries of NDPC.
- 8. Tap **SAVE**.

How to enter your Pledge using the App

- 1. Open the Realm Connect app.
 - If you are not logged in, please do so.
- 2. At the bottom of the screen tap the **Giving** icon.
- 3. At the top of the Giving screen, tap **Pledges**.
- 4. Tap the blue banner Make a Pledge.
- 5. The Pledge screen opens. Make sure the **Start Date** and **End Date** are for the coming year.
- 6. Before you enter the **Amount**, decide whether you want to set up a recurring gift (e.g. Once a Month). If so, select **Set a Schedule**. If you would rather enter your total pledge and give as you are able throughout the year, select As Can.
- 7. Enter the **Amount** you want to pledge.
 - Note that the number you enter in the "Amount Pledged" field is the amount per payment. The "Total Pledge" will calculate automatically.
